Students are required to earn 63 credits during seven terms, culminating in a Project Demonstrating Excellence. The Doctor of Counselling and Psychotherapy program facilitates mastery of counselling and psychotherapy and career advancement while preparing the highly competent counsellor and psychotherapist to contribute community service. To be considered for admission, applicants must possess a master's degree in counselling or a related discipline and experience in counselling and psychotherapy. Students complete 42h of required Computer Science courses, 24h of other core degree requirements and choose from among the following three possible paths of study (54h each): (1) Interdisciplinary Study (including completion of a Minor); (2) Defined Option (includes the equivalent of the three previously-approved specializations and a new option in Data Analytics); or (3) Second Major. Master of Science in Business	New	Dal is proposing a new Master of Science in Business to be completed over 16 months (four semesters) of full-time study commencing and ending in fall semesters. A part-time option is not proposed. To obtain the 30ch degree, students complete a compulsory non-credit Research Workshop, 18ch of coursework, and a 12ch thesis. As the program has a research focus, it is intended to prepare students to enter into doctoral-level studies in Business or to enter a role in a corporate setting that requires analytical skills. Bachelor of Management (multiple programs)	Modification	Dal is proposing to modify core courses within its Bachelor of Management degree in response to the results of internal and external reviews. Among other changes, the modified program includes revisions to introductory courses, the addition of new courses in Data Literacy, Ethics and Social Responsibility, Data Analytics and Applied Research, and the introduction of a new capstone course in fourth year. Master of Business Administration in Global Leadership	Modification	UPEI is proposing a new, full-time MBA in Global Leadership to complement its existing part-time program. The degree will be offered via a cohort model of delivery beginning with a zero-credit MBA orientation module followed by two terms (fall and winter) of five (3ch) courses each then a final term of four courses, including an international capstone project. Interdisciplinary PhD in Sustainable Design Engineering	New	UPEI is proposing a new interdisciplinary PhD in Sustainable Design Engineering. Students will be required to complete four graduate-level courses (chosen from among seven SDE-specific courses or relevant courses offered in other UPEI PhDs) and a seminar course plus a comprehensive exam, a thesis and a final oral thesis defense. Professional Master of Actuarial Science	New	UPEI is proposing a Professional Master of Actuarial Science to be completed via a cohort model of delivery over two years (four semesters) of full-time study; a part-time option is not proposed. The program is a terminal degree and is not designed as a lead-in to further academic studies. Based on a student's level of academic performance and average within the program, they will receive credit toward related actuarial exams through the Canadian Institute of Actuaries. Doctor of Psychology (PsyD) in Clinical Psychology	New	UPEI is proposing to implement a four-year Doctor of Psychology (PsyD) that would prepare graduates to practice as registered clinical psychologists. The program includes 22 required courses, three clinical practica (200 hours each), a (50 hour) community intervention practicum, a dissertation (four associated courses), and a 12month clinical internship.
